# Our Expectations

- In the upper juniors, we have lots of fun trips, residentials etc — but we also work hard.
- As we are top of the school expectations are higher for both work and behaviour. # Homework

## READING

It is expected that the children read **every night for at least 20-30 minutes**. The children will be given a reading record card and their reading will be monitored through their use of Accelerated Reader. ## SPELLING

Spellings will be taught in class on a Monday and the children will complete activities throughout the week. These spellings will be set online every week and progress will be monitored through Spelling Shed quizzes that have been completed online at **least three times a week for around 5-10 minutes** (not through weekly tests in class). <https://www.spellingshed.com/en-gb/>

# Homework

## MATHS

Weekly maths homework will be set on MyMaths to consolidate the children's learning in class from that week and then later on in the year the children will be set reasoning questions on diagnostic questions. 

# Class Rewards



Last year, each class introduced a class reward jar. In year 5, we have pom poms.

In addition to earning reward points, the children can earn pom poms. The pom poms go in to the jar at the front — once it is full, the children will receive their reward.

# General Reminders

## Uniform

We are almost at the top of the school now and are therefore role models to the younger children. Please ensure you look smart when entering and leaving school (shirts tucked in, collars done up etc.). NO jewellery is allowed except from small stud earrings.

All children must wear their hair up if it is longer than shoulder length — this is school policy and is not only for health and safety reasons but also because it can be a distraction.

## Names in clothes

Please ensure that your child's uniform is named. Despite being in year 5, we do still have uniform that seems to sprout legs during PE!! Lateness — Please note the school day officially starts at 8.55: we run groups and catch up sessions in the first 15-20 minutes of the day, so it is really important your child is here on time.

Children will be brought out the playground as normal, please arrive promptly to collect by 3.15, your children will be dismissed near the sheltered area. If you give your permission for your child to walk home, please let the office know.
