

Reading for pleasure is fundamental to a child's academic progress. At St. Nicholas we encourage all of our children to read everyday. However, we can't do this without YOU! Encouraging positive reading habits is crucial for every child, in every year group. This starts by sharing books with your child in Year R to ensuring your child in Year 6 is reading for a minimum of 25-30 minutes / day.

Dover Castle staff, members of the public and the coach driver all commented on how smart, polite and considerate the children were - they should feel extremely proud. A great day was had by all!


Cross Country: Courage and Resilience, it's a St Nicholas Thing!
